

STATE OF ILLINOIS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2021-2022

<p>DTP or DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis) First entry into school (Kindergarten or First grade)</p>	<p>4 or more doses, with the last booster dose given on/after the 4th birthday</p>
<p>DTP or DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis) All other grades 1-12 if 1st grade is not 1st year of entry into school.</p>	<p>Three or more doses of DTP/DTaP or Td; with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4th birthday</p>
<p>Tdap* (Tetanus and Pertussis) 6th – 12th</p>	<p>1 dose of Tdap for students entering 6th grade, for students who are 11 years and older. *The DTP, DTap, DT or Td immunizations are not the same vaccine as the Tdap and do not count as the Tdap requirement.</p>
<p>OPV or IPV (Polio)</p>	<p>Four dose series with the last dose administered on or after the 4th birthday.</p>
<p>MMR K – 12th</p>	<p>2 doses each of the Measles, Mumps & Rubella vaccines.</p>
<p>Hepatitis B</p>	<p>3 doses series in accordance with ACIP guidance.</p>
<p>Lead Screening</p>	<p>Lead screening is a required part of the health examination for children age 6 months to 7 years prior to admission to kindergarten or first grade.</p>
<p>Varicella* (Chickenpox) K-12th</p>	<p>Two doses of Varicella for students entering K-12 *If your child has already had Chickenpox, then you or your doctor must report the disease history in order to be exempt from the vaccine requirement.</p>
<p>Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine MCV4 (Meningitis) 6th & 12th grade only</p>	<p>1 dose of MCV4 for entry into 6th grade and 2 doses for 12th graders. The first dose must be given on/after the 11th birthday and the 2nd dose must be given on/after the 16th birthday. If, however, the first dose is received after the 16th birthday then only 1 dose is required. Progressive requirement</p>

Deadline for Immunizations - October 15, 2021

Immunization requirements subject to change based off of IDPH immunization requirements

In addition to being in compliance relative to immunizations, students must receive a physical exam prior to entering Illinois schools for the first time, prior to the date of entering Kindergarten or 1st grade, 6th grade, and 9th grade. Students will be considered to be in noncompliance whether or not they have received the required immunizations.

The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations, vaccine doses given up to four days before minimum interval or age can be counted as valid. However, this does not apply to intervals between live vaccines. Live vaccines shall not be given fewer than 28 days apart.
