OVERVIEW

St. Edward Central Catholic High School opened in the fall of 1941 in Elgin, IL, staffed by the Sisters of St. Dominic from Adrian, Michigan and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 1944. St. Edward is a private, Catholic, four-year, college preparatory high school, serving grades 9 - 12, in the Diocese of Rockford, IL.

MISSION STATEMENT

Saint Edward Central Catholic High School is a college preparatory, faith-centered Catholic community. Our mission is to nurture the discipleship of Jesus Christ and to promote excellence in education. To further this mission, St. Edward CCHS enables its students to develop life-long skills and abilities that will help them become empathic, responsible, and productive citizens.

ADMISSIONS

It has always been the teaching of the Catholic Church that every Catholic child shall have an equal right to be educated in a Catholic School. Every child should be entitled to admission to St. Edward CCHS without regard to race, national origin, sex, ethnicity, immigration status, or socioeconomic status. Admission is based on, but not limited to, the entrance exam score and junior high school grades. Applicants are considered in one of two classifications: Incoming Freshman Student entering St. Edward in the ninth grade or Transfer Students, whose academic, attendance, and behavior records are in good standing may be admitted.

ACCREDITATION

St. Edward CCHS is accredited by the **National Catholic Education Association, Cognia, and the Illinois State Board of Education.**

CURRICULUM

St. Edward CCHS has an 8 period school day. Students enroll in up to 7 academic courses that are 45 minutes long and get a 25 minute lunch and a 25 minute Resource period.

St. Edward CCHS offers 19 Honors courses, 7 Advanced Placement courses, and 5 Dual Credit courses. Student enrollment in AP or Honors classes is based on proficiency of subject, current GPA, and teacher recommendations. AP Courses offered in the 23-24 school year include: AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Chemistry, AP English Language & Composition, AP English Literature & Composition, AP Psychology, & AP Statistics. Dual Credit courses are offered in partnership with Benedictine University. Dual Credit Courses include AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, Astronomy, AP Multivariable Calculus, and AP Statistics.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate from St. Edward CCHS, a student must successfully complete a minimum of 24 credits including required courses. In addition, each student must pass the Federal and Illinois State Constitution Tests, complete 40-hours of community service and participate in annual spiritual retreats.
